

came hard. I found myself starting street life and begging. I was introduced to bad behaviours like sniffing glue & other drugs, pick pocketing among others. I thank God who came to rescue my life through Pavement to Prosperity program. Now I am a changed person. I'm now in a vocation school; acquiring skills in catering. I have a good chance to dream a again.

PROJECT SUSTAINABLITY

We are continuing raising chicken for meat and sell for project sustainability and boys life skill training.

For past quarter we were in a position to raise a substantial numbers of chicken. Like any other business, we face challenges and successes, opportunities and threats.

In our recent analysis, we pointed out two other income project that we would like add to broaden our project sustainability.

- 1. Now because we have water, we need to develop a comprehensive irrigation farming and a possible green-house farming.
- 2. Dairy cow farming-We need one milk productive cow, being in an environment where milk is highly marketable.
- 3. Two car wash machines-It would add value to the boys as they wait for their I.D processing and bring money for their transition time.
